Directions for Using Matrix	
Behaviors	Every behavior has a rule number associated with it and a corresponding definition for schools to select the appropriate behavior when completing Office Discipline Referrals (ODR) in SIS. Please read each definition fully to ensure the student's behavior matches the code of conduct behavior description.
Immediate Actions	For specific behaviors, immediate actions are steps that schools need to take before proceeding with discipline.
Intervention and Response Levels	The responses that may be warranted depending on the severity of the behavior.
Intervention and Response Level Considerations	Guidance that should be read for each specific behavior. The corresponding <u>discipline guide</u> should be utilzied as a resource on interventions.
Grade Levels (K-12, 3-12, 6-12)	The grade levels indicate what interventions/response that CAN be implemented per grade. For example, only grades 3-12 can receive out of school suspensions. However, just because a behavior CAN reach a level 4 or 5, does not meet a school should move to that level. Schools are expected to utilize in-school interventions and take into consider multiple factors before proceeding with exclusion.
Does Not Apply (X)	This means that the response level does not apply to the behavior.

Philadelphia Police Department	In schools with a School Safety Officer (SSO), when there is an incident which may be a crime, <b>the administrator should</b> <b>notify the SSO prior to making any police referral for the potential arrest of a student</b> . <u>The SSO will contact the PPD</u> <u>Diversion Program at 215-400-5526 / 215-400-5530 to determine if the offense is eligible</u> . Offenses not eligible for diversion will be referred to the Philadelphia Police Department. Schools without a safety officer are directed to contact the PPD and their School Safety Area Manager.
